As always as Chester Blue Coat, we want to work in a partnership with you so if you have any concerns or worries about your child please do contact the class teachers in the first instance.

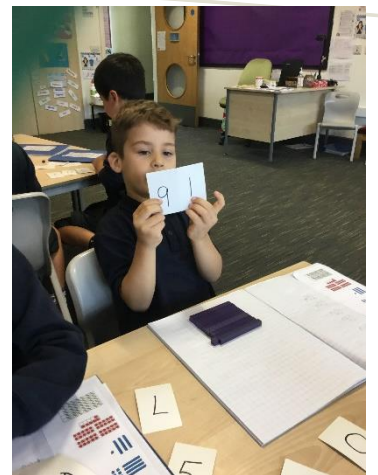
